

2023 Annual 2024 Report



Highlights of the Year

• Longitudinal Family Physician Payment (LFP) Model Expansion

The year saw continued uptake and support for the LFP model, with its expansion into facility-based care in early 2024. SNO facilitated engagement sessions with family physicians, fostering the exchange of ideas and best practices.

• Launch of Patient Education Video

SNO introduced its first patient education video aimed at helping individuals navigate the healthcare system. The video provides guidance on when to access services, aiming to improve efficiency and overall system awareness. <u>Watchthevideo here.</u> Please refer to image A.

• Wildfire Response and Support

In August 2023, wildfires ravaged the Shuswap North Okanagan region. SNO played a vital role in the North Okanagan Incident Command structure, effectively communicating critical information to healthcare providers and ensuring evacuation protocols were followed to protect providers, patients, and the wider community.

Walk-In Clinic Closures

2023 presented significant challenges for walk-in clinics across the province, and Vernon was no exception, with the closure of its last two clinics. SNO engaged with physicians, community stakeholders, and the Ministry to explore solutions. However, a shortage of primary care providers, a growing number of orphaned patients, and rigid funding structures hindered progress. SNO continues to work within its mandate to address these issues.

• Shuswap Saturday Clinic

In response to the lack of after-hours care and walk-in clinics, the Family Physicians came together to find creative solutions to the problem. The Shuswap Saturday Clinic was launched on October 1, 2023. From October 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024, the clinic saw 446 patients over 24 Saturdays, averaging 18.5 patients per session, potentially reducing visits to the emergency department. *Please refer to image B.*

• Attachment Strategy Implementation

SNO hired two Attachment Coordinators to support the SNO PCN Service Plan Attachment Strategy, successfully attaching 223 patients to primary care providers through the Health Connect Registry.

• Prenatal Classes in Salmon Arm

Salmon Arm maternity providers launched a series of prenatal classes focused on labor, delivery, and postpartum support. The first two sessions were attended by 43 expectant mothers, with participation later increasing to 70, including spouses and support persons. *Please refer to image C*.

• After-Hours Care Program Pilot

SNO successfully lobbied for Family Physicians and Nurse Practitioners to be added to the FPSC After-Hours Care Program pilot, launched in January 2024. with 90% of SNO family physicians and nurse practitioners registered, the program has been an invaluable support for both providers and patients. *Please refer to image D*.

• Pathways Public Facing Portal

SNO supported the launch of the public-facing Pathways portal, designed to help patients navigate healthcare resources and services. *Access the SNO Pathways website here*.

Highlights of the Year Continued

• UBC North Okanagan Family Residency Program

The UBC North Okanagan Family Residency Program commenced this year, and SNO is committed to supporting its collaboration with site director, Dr. Travis Allen, faculty, and family practice residents, aiming to strengthen recruitment and retention efforts.

Recruitment Successes

SNO achieved successful recruitment through UBC's International Medical Graduate (IMG) program, with Dr. David Barrett joining Mainstreet Medical in Vernon. Additionally, two physicians were matched through the Practice Ready Assessment (PRA) program: Dr. Lucky Kotingo (Sicamous Community Health Centre) and Dr. Husni Abdalla (Enderby Health Centre).

Community Partnerships

SNO continues to build and strengthen community partnerships in all our communities, culminating in a presentation at the Southern Interior Local Government Association Convention to discuss Physician Recruitment and how communities can support recruitment and retention.

• Primary Care Network (PCN) Updates

- Formation of the PCN Steering Committee and adoption of Terms of Reference
- Focus on two key strategies: Attachment via NP recruitment and implementation of team based care
- Overcoming space challenges and securing space for the Vernon PCN Hub, located at the Vernon Health Unit
- Recruitment of allied health professionals, including pharmacy, integrated care coordinators, physiotherapists, social workers, and primary care nurses
- Successful Nurse Practitioner recruitment to all seven SNO communities support the attachment strategy. 12 Nurse Practitioners have been hired to date, with two additional NP's joining SNO in September 2024 and March 2025.
- Collaboration with the Okanagan Indian Band (OKIB) and Interior Health has expanded primary care services, with a second family physician joining to increase access. A nurse practitioner has also been successfully recruited to serve the Splatsin First Nation, further strengthening their primary care services.
