Highlights of the Year

- This year saw an improvement in relationships with our Interior Health and community partners. As a result, we are engaged in more meaningful dialogue and have planted the seeds for the future collaborative work of developing Primary Care Networks.
- We have successfully recruited two Patient Voices partners to our Collaborative Services Committee (CSC). The patient voice brings a fresh perspective to the table and reminds us to keep focused on what is important, namely effective and efficient delivery of Primary Health Care services.
- The Vernon Urgent Primary Care Centre (UPCC) is an example of what can be achieved when there is an invitation to collaborate and partner on an initiative. The UPCC had a soft opening on October 1st 2019, and moved into their new space April 1st, 2020. Drs Reta Kutsche, Maggie McKnight and Mark Ansdell were instrumental in the development of the UPCC. The UPCC is a much-needed service for our vulnerable, marginalized population.
- With Patient Medical Home funding, the Division was able to continue to support:

- Our Physician Wellness Program officially baptized as Calmer Suture Group has been very active in bring physicians together in a safe space to discuss issues, share experiences and have some much-needed downtime.
- We held our first **Physician Mindfulness Wellness Retreat** in January 2020 with excellent feedback and requests to offer similar retreats on an annual basis.
- Physician Digital Marketing Campaign produced two recruitment videos which have been incredibly helpful
 as a recruitment tool. These videos have also been shared with Facility Engagement to support their recruitment
 efforts.
- Three communities were successful in recruiting International Medical Graduates. Vernon, Salmon Arm and Lumby will welcome their new physicians in Summer 2020.
- **Vernon Seniors Action Network** has successfully petitioned Vernon City Council with a request to pursue a provincial designation as an Age-Friendly Community in BC.
- Under the leadership of **Dr. Barb McKinnon** and musical direction from **Andrea Roberts**, **Salmon Arm's Intergenerational Choir** had another successful year but were unable to perform their year-end function due to COVID-19.
- Physician collegiality and networking opportunities: Evening with General Surgery; Internal Medicine (Salmon Arm), Men's Health evening, Child and Youth Mental Health evening with Compass, MRI and Lumbar imaging, ICBC presentation, MAiD and CME on the Run Series
- We partnered with the City of Vernon and the Harm Reduction Team (HART) to present an educational evening on the Opioid crisis. The presentation included Peer Mentors with lived experience and was a powerful reminder that the Opioid crisis in also in our communities.
- Continue to build and foster relationships with our smaller rural communities Lumby, Sicamous and Sorrento as well as with our First Nations Partners Splatsin First Nation and the Vernon Metis Association.
- We successfully embarked on two Shared Care projects in Salmon Arm: A Pain Passport for Patients and the development of a Maternity Network including Midwifery support.






